School Grounds Actions

Keep our playgrounds clean and tidy:

- Tidy up and organise our playground equipment.

Playground Leaders

- Each class must nominate a playground leader each week.
- The playground leader will make sure all the equipment is tidied away at the end of each play time and lunch time.

- All classes should display who their playground leaders is each week.

- If you see any litter during play time, pick it up and put in the bin.
